

## Expand Your Musical Horizons — episode 76

Greetings, chillers...welcome to episode 76 of "Expand Your Musical Horizons." We've got over an hour of music ahead, with downtempo, psybient, dub, and indie tracks from all over the world....and I've included some new tracks from the latest releases from SINE Music and Cosmicleaf Records.

Those of you who listen to this podcast regularly know the format already — I'll introduce the first track and then announce all the artists and track information at the end of this episode.

And if you're playing this music through iTunes or most web browsers, you should see the artist names and album art while the track is playing.

So let's get started. This first track is from a Los Angeles musician that I found on SoundCloud. He makes music under the name Titus and the Raindrops. The track is called "Arc." Relax and enjoy the ride...

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And that's the end of episode 76. Ready for the tracklist?

**Track 1** was **Titus and the Raindrops**—from the USA—with "Arc." It's from an untitled album that you can find on Bandcamp. Titus and the Raindrops has gained a following on SoundCloud and was even named "SoundCloud of the Day" a few months ago. So please visit his page on SoundCloud or Bandcamp and listen to more of his work.

**Track 2** was **Merge of Equals**—also known as Flavio Maspoli, from Zurich, Switzerland—with "Don't Worry," from his newest release — called "Submerge" —on the SINE Music label. You can buy this album on iTunes or Amazon.

You've heard Merge of Equals before in this podcast, in episodes 49 and 53. His music has been included in a number of chillout compilations, and if you like his work, please give him your support.

**Track 3** was **Anitek**—from the USA—with "Blueprint," from his release "Mind Express," which you can find on Jamendo.com. To hear more of his music, visit his page on Jamendo or on MySpace, or visit his YouTube site.

**Track 4** was **Microdots**— from Helsinki, Finland—with "Underwater Adventures." I found this track on SoundCloud. He is currently unsigned. If you like this track, please visit him on his SoundCloud page or on MySpace to hear more of his work.

**Track 5** was **Aquascape**—from Moscow Russia—with “Sunrise,” from the compilation “Tunguska Chillout Grooves, Volume 7,” which you can find on Jamendo.com. Aquascape is comprised of two musicians, Andrey Kostomarov and Anton Salikov. You’ve heard their music in another episode of this podcast, in episode 42.

In addition, they’ve been a featured artist in other compilation albums, including DJ Zen’s “Peace Therapy 3” on Kagdila Records. To learn more about them, visit their MySpace page.

**Track 6** was **Eguana**— from Greece—with “Frozen Heart,” from his new release “Space Lines” on Cosmicleaf Records. You can buy this release from iTunes, Amazon, and other online music sellers. To learn more about Eguana’s music, visit his MySpace page.

**Track 7** was **PKarel**—from the Czech Republic—with “Oxygene,” from his release “Urban Symphony,” which you can download from his website at pkarel.cz. You can also find him on Facebook and on Vimeo. I think I discovered this artist through DeepGoa in Switzerland...so thanks for that tip!

**Track 8** was from a Swedish indie group called **Garmisch**, and it’s called “München.” It’s from a Netbloc compilation called “Netbloc Vol. 10 — Postmodernism is dead.” Netbloc distributes independent music with a Creative Commons license and puts it all together in nicely packaged albums with liner notes for you to enjoy and to download.

An entire Garmisch album was released by Netbloc, and the track you heard in this episode was recorded earlier, when they went by the name Garmisch Partenkirchen. To learn more about them, see their website at garmisch.se.

**Track 9** was from a French artist named **Sushidread**. It’s called “Rise,” and it’s from the compilation “Dub Tentacles 3,” which you can find on the Fresh Poulp netlabel. To learn more about Sushidread, visit his MySpace page.

**Track 10** was an artist who goes by the name **Icesun**, with a remix I found on ccMixter called “This Night is Ours.” She’s from Italy, and you can also find her music on Jamendo.com.

**Track 11** was **Tectonic**— from the USA—with “Listening Glass,” featuring Rachel Bower. It’s from their release “Shifting Sands,” which you can buy from Bandcamp.

**Track 12** was **Chill Carrier**—from Germany—with “Left Up There,” from the release on Jamendo.com with the same name. The story behind this track is that it expresses what it might feel like to be an astronaut who gets abandoned in space. Chill Carrier was also featured in episode 48 of this podcast.

He’s also known as Sebastian Kretzschmar, and you can hear more of his music on his website, on Jamendo, or by listening to some episodes from my friends Andreas and Jürgen at XtraChill, the German chillout podcast.

And finally, **track 13** was **Cydelix**— from Greece—with “Fiber Optic,” from his new release called “Preparing the Next Generation” on Cosmicleaf Records. You can buy this album from iTunes, Amazon, and other music sellers.

And that’s it for this episode. I hope this leads to more music discoveries for you. There’s so much great music to hear, whether it’s from web radio stations or streaming sites or podcasts like this one. You just need to know where to find the music you like.
